



2022 Summary

In 2022, we broadened our programs at the request of workerowners, and built on work from 2021. We embarked on the first year of our strategic plan, meeting goals such as creating a new Welcome Packet to introduce MadWorC to local cooperators, starting a survey of local worker cooperatives, publishing a Shop Co-op list to help community members learn about worker cooperatives, and approving our Inclusion Statement. We also started a new path for cooperative development, building partnerships with community organizations, and creating more opportunities for cooperatives to support each other and work together.

We held a monthly social event which drew worker-owners from a variety of cooperatives, both new and existing, in addition to our monthly business meetings.

Our book club also continued through the first half of 2022 before taking a fall hiatus.

Our 3rd annual Regional Rendezvous was in April 2022. For the second year in a row, we held the event online due to the ongoing pandemic. With support from our generous sponsors, we translated all written materials and interpreted all sessions into Spanish. Most sessions were also recorded and are available on our YouTube channel.

We also debuted our new logo, with thanks to board member Esther West.

We were again awarded a grant from the Madison Cooperative Development Coalition to support our work to build worker cooperation in Madison.

We ended the year with a discussion about worker cooperatives on WORT's Access Hour, featuring members of new and long-term worker cooperatives!

MadWorC is a member of the US Federation of Worker Cooperatives and the New Economy Coalition. We are also engaged in the effort to build a Worker Co-op Solidarity Fund and the Co-op Connection Network, both of which started as ideas at the 2021 Regional Rendezvous.


